Sec. 10-3-1 Parades; permit required.

It shall be unlawful for any person to participate in, conduct or accompany any organized parade or procession, other than a funeral procession, on the public streets, sidewalks or other public property in the city unless an application has been previously filed and a permit granted to conduct such parade or procession within the city.

Sec. 10-3-4 Clean-up.

(a) The permit holder shall be responsible for the clean-up of any litter or debris on public property caused by the parade. Such litter shall include, but not be limited to: (1) any paper or other waste or debris left on the streets by floats or units of parade; or (2) any paper wrappings, flyers or other items discarded by members of the public after being received from participants in the parade.

(b) Failure to clean up litter or debris following a parade, as specified in subsection (a) shall constitute a violation of this code, and shall, upon conviction, be punishable as provided in section 1-1-8.

(c) Provided that, permit holders may, at the time of obtaining a permit, pay an additional clean-up fee in such amount as fixed from time to time by the mayor and council. Payment of such clean-up fee shall relieve the permit holder of responsibility for cleaning of public property as required by subsection (a).
